Enclosed please find Idaho's request to extend the above ABAWD waivers for Idaho's Tribal Reservation areas. Using Idaho Department of Labor Statistics, Waiver #970161 exempts residents of the Coeur d'Alene Reservation due to an unemployment rate exceeding 10%. Waiver #970162 exempts residents of the Nez Perce, Fort Hall and Duck Valley Reservations based on their unemployment rates exceeding 10%, and the Kootenai Reservation due to it being a Labor Surplus Area.

We have reviewed the State's request and justification and recommend approving the waivers as requested for an additional one-year period through March 31, 2003.

According to the Idaho Department of Labor statistics for the period June 2000 to July 2001, the unemployment rate for this reservation was 16.9 percent. The unemployment rate for this Reservation has remained high for the past 2 years. This area qualifies for a waiver of the work requirement.

Justification for Request:

This is an Agency option per Section 6(o)(4) of the Food Stamp Act.

Anticipated Impact on Households and State Agency Operations:

This waiver would allow individuals residing on the Coeur d'Alene Reservation which has unemployment of more than 10 percent to be exempt from the work requirement and to continue receiving Food Stamps.

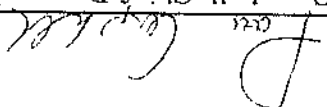

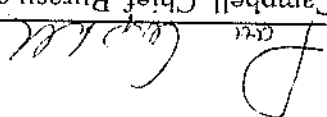
