Dear Mr. Canavan:

Please find the enclosed request of extension for waiver #970315. This waiver allowed residents of designated areas in Maine to be exempt from time limited accessibility to the food stamp program as described at Section 824 of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act. We have removed the municipality of Sanford from this waiver request as its unemployment rate does not exceed the national average by 20% for the preceding 24 months or in the preceding two calendar years.

The unemployment rates for the other areas exceeded the national average rate by more than 20 per cent for the time periods used in the comparisons.

WAIVER REQUEST OUTLINE

7. **Regulatory requirements:**

Section 6(o) of the Food Stamp Act, as amended by Section 824 of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA), P.L. 104-193, provides that no individual shall be eligible to participate in the Food Stamp Program as a member of any household if, during the preceding 36 month period, the individual received food stamp benefits for not less than 3 months (consecutive or otherwise), during which the individual did not work 20 hours or more per week, averaged monthly; did not participate in and comply with the requirements of a work program for 20 hours or more per week; or did not participate in and comply with requirements of a program under section 20 or a comparable program established by the State.

Section 6(o) of the Food Stamp Act, as amended by Section 824 of the PRWORA, also provides that, upon the request of a State agency, the Secretary may waive the applicability of the above provision for any group of individuals in the State if the Secretary makes a determination that the area in which the individuals reside has an unemployment rate of over 10 percent, or does not have a sufficient number of jobs to provide employment for the individuals.

8. **Proposed alternative procedures:**

The State of Maine is requesting to extend its waiver of the requirements of Section 824 of the PRWORA on the basis of insufficient jobs for the residents of the municipality of Gardiner and also of the following LMAs: Dexter-Pittsfield, Lincoln-Howland, Outer Bangor, Millinocket-East Millinocket, and Patten-Island Falls. Our current waiver included the municipality of Sanford which no longer meets the threshold.

9. Justification for request:

The national average unemployment rate for the period of June 1999 through May 2001 was 4.13. The average unemployment rate for the LMAs covered in this waiver, other than the Outer Bangor LMA, exceeds 1.20 percent of the national average for that time period which equalled 4.96 percent.

The Outer Bangor LMA's unemployment rate for the past two calendar years (1999 and 2000) was at a 5.14 percent average. The municipality of Gardiner's unemployment rate for this same time period was 6.2 percent. The national average for that time period was 4.12 percent. The 1.20 rate for this time period equalled 4.94 percent.

10. Anticipated impact on households and State agency operations:

This waiver will provide consistency for households and State agency operations in areas where unemployment remains higher than the national average.

11. Caseload information, including percent, characteristics, and quality control error rate for affected portion:

The caseload for these areas represent 8% of the caseload for the state. There are no quality control procedures involved.

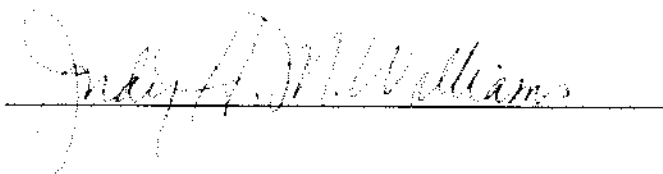
12. Anticipated implementation date and time period for which waiver is needed:

This waiver currently has an expiration date of October 31, 2001. We request a one-year extension.

Most current data for a 24 month period:

National average unemployment rate for June, 1999 through May, 2001 was 4.13.

$$4.13 \times 1.20 = 4.96$$

Lincoln-Howland	6.0
Millinocket-East Millinocket	6.3
Patten-Island Falls	7.2

FOR THE OUTER BANGOR LMA AND THE MUNICIPALITY OF GARDINER:

Data for the calendar years of 1999 and 2000 time period:

National average unemployment rate averaged to be 4.12.

$$4.12 \times 1.20 = 4.94$$

Average unemployment rates for the same time period for the following areas were:

Outer Bangor	5.14
Gardiner	6.2
