These counties are Dickinson, Menominee, Leelanau, Grand Traverse, Kalamazoo, Benzie, Mason, Lake, Osceola, Mecosta, Isabella, Midland, Newaygo, Muskegon, Montcalm, Gratiot, Saginaw, Genesee, Lapeer, St. Clair, Macomb, Wayne, Jackson, Calhoun, Kalamazoo, Van Buren, Berrien, Cass, St. Joseph, Branch, Hillsdale, Lenawee, and Monroe.

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
