

STATE WAIVER REQUEST

2. **Type of request:** Amendment and Extension
3. **Statutory citation:** Section 6(o) of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008
4. **Regulatory citation:** 7 CFR 273.24
5. **State:** Wisconsin
6. **Region:** Midwest
7. **Regulatory requirements:**

Section 6(o) of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, provides that no able-bodied adult without dependents (ABAWD) shall be eligible to participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) as a member of any household if the individual received program benefits for more than 3 months during any 3-year period in which the individual was subject to but did not comply with the ABAWD work requirement. Section 6(o) also provides that, upon the request of the State agency, the Secretary may waive the applicability of the 3-month ABAWD time limit for any group of individuals in the State if the Secretary makes a determination that the area in which the individuals reside has an unemployment rate of over 10 percent, or does not have a sufficient number of jobs to provide employment for the individuals.
8. **Description of alternative procedures:**

The State of Wisconsin is requesting to exempt able-bodied adults without dependents (ABAWDs) residing in the entire state from SNAP time limits at 7 CFR 273.24.
9. **Justification for request:**

Under SNAP regulations at 7 CFR 273.24(f)(2), the State may support a claim of insufficient jobs by submitting evidence that the State qualifies for extended unemployment benefits within the past 12 months.

26 USC 3304 (Public Law 102-318) allows States to use a trigger for the extended benefits program, based on the State's insured unemployment rate (IUR) for the most recent 13 weeks reaching at least: (1) 5 percent; and (2) 120 percent of such IUR for the corresponding 13-week periods ending in each of the two preceding calendar years; or (3) 6 percent regardless of the preceding calendar years.

The Department of Labor's Trigger Notice No. 2020-38¹ shows the State's 13-week insured unemployment rate (IUR) was: (1) 6.05 percent and (2) 720 percent of the 13-week rate for the corresponding period in the two preceding years, making the State eligible for extended unemployment benefits.

10. Anticipated impact on households and State agency operations:

This waiver will benefit households because they will still have the option to participate in SNAP E&T to improve their employment prospects without concern of losing SNAP benefits due to acquiring three TLBs while the State's economy recovers from the COVID pandemic. The waiver will also provide consistency for households and State agency operations including less communication from members due to cases closing.

11. Caseload information, including percent, characteristics, and quality control error rate for affection portion (if applicable):

This waiver affects all ABAWDs in the entire state. Wisconsin estimates that there will be approximately 11,750 ABAWDs in the State in FY2022.

12. Anticipated implementation date and time period for which waiver is needed:

The State is requesting a one-year waiver, from October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022.

There are no special quality control procedures needed in conjunction with this waiver.
