RE: SNAP – District of Columbia Request to Waive Able-bodied Adults without  
Dependents Time Limit - Extension – Approval

Dear Ms. Carroll:

This is in response to the District of Columbia Department of Human Services' request for an extension of its waiver to exempt able-bodied adults without dependents (ABAWD) throughout the State from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) time limit at 7 CFR 273.24.

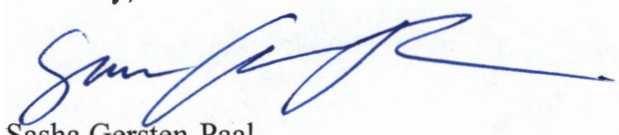
The District of Columbia State agency has requested an extension of its current statewide waiver of the ABAWD time limit. The District's current waiver is effective through September 30, 2015. The District has supported its extension request based upon qualification for extended unemployment benefits, a criterion for waiver approval provided by SNAP regulations at 7 CFR 273.24. The State has provided a copy of the Department of Labor's Emergency Unemployment Compensation (EUC) trigger notice 2013-49, effective December 22, 2013, showing that the District qualified for EUC, an extended unemployment benefit program. Following longstanding Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) policy, States can qualify for a 12-month Statewide waiver for up to 12 months after the trigger date. Based upon EUC trigger notice 2013-49, the District is eligible for a Statewide ABAWD time limit waiver from December 2014 through December 2015, which would extend its current ABAWD time limit waiver by 3 months.

FNS is approving District of Columbia's request to extend its waiver of the ABAWD time limit by 3 months, from October 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015. Although the District has requested an extension through March 31, 2016, the documentation provided in support of this waiver request does not support extension for that period of time. However, FNS would consider future requests with supporting documentation to waive the ABAWD time limit in the District in accordance with SNAP regulations at 7 CFR 273.24. Please also note that FNS has assigned waiver number 2150043 to this extension approval for tracking purposes. The detailed waiver response is attached.

## WAIVER RESPONSE

1. **Waiver Serial Number:** 2150043
2. **Type of Request:** Extension
3. **Primary regulation citation:** 7 CFR 273.24
4. **State:** District of Columbia
5. **Region:** Mid-Atlantic
6. **Regulatory Requirement:** Federal regulations at 7 CFR 273.24 provide that no able-bodied adult without dependents (ABAWD) shall be eligible to participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) as a member of any household if the individual received program benefits for more than 3 months during any 3-year period in which the individual was subject to, but did not comply with the ABAWD work requirements. Regulations at 7 CFR 273.24(a) provide that fulfilling the work requirement means: working 20 hours or more per week, averaged monthly; participating in and complying with the requirements of a work program or a workfare program for at least 20 hours per week; or any combination of working and participating in a work program for a total of 20 hours per week.  
  
Under SNAP regulations at 7 CFR 273.24(f)(2)(ii), a State can qualify for a 12-month statewide waiver of the ABAWD time limit if the Department of Labor's Unemployment Insurance Service determines that the State qualifies for extended unemployment benefits. The Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) can approve a waiver if the State qualifies for extended benefits, regardless of whether the State has elected the option to offer the benefit itself. States that meet the extended benefit criteria can qualify for a 12-month statewide ABAWD waiver up to 12 months after the trigger date.
7. **Description of proposed alternative procedures:** The District of Columbia is requesting to waive the ABAWD time limit at 7 CFR 273.24 from October 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015.
8. **Action and reason for approval or denial:** FNS is approving the District of Columbia's request to waive the ABAWD time limit because the District meets the requirements for approval provided at 7 CFR 273.24(f)(2)(ii). The District qualified for extended unemployment benefits through the Department of Labor's Emergency Unemployment Compensation (EUC) trigger notice 2013-49, effective December 22, 2013.
9. **Regulatory or legislative basis for action:** This waiver is approved pursuant to 7 CFR 273.24(f)(1)(ii).

10. **Conditions and reasons:** None.
11. **Information required for extension:** To receive an extension the State agency must provide FNS with a formal waiver request supported by data or other information as described in 7 CFR 273.24(f). If the State requests extension based upon unemployment rates, it must provide FNS with all supporting documentation, including data spreadsheets.
12. **Expiration date:** This waiver extension is effective October 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015.
13. **Limitation, if any, on regional office approval of like requests:** This waiver is limited to the District of Columbia Department of Human Services.
